Turn-in-the-road Answers

Why is this manoeuvre often referred to as a 3 point turn?

Traditionally this manoeuvre was competed in three moves – as an advanced driver you should be able to do the manoeuvre in the fewest possible moves – in most suitable roads this will be three.

What are the three main aspects that the examiner will mark when assessing this manoeuvre?

Observation, control and accuracy – however, remember that observation includes the ability to make good decisions based o what you see.

How do you control the car's speed as you drop down the road camber towards the kerb?

By use of the footbrake - with the clutch down.

On the final leg where do you look?

use general all around observation for safety, to check for other road users, and out of the driver's window for accuracy, looking well ahead along the road.

What would you do if another vehicle approaches during the manoeuvre?

Make eye-contact with the driver and be prepared to give way if necessary.
